As you read through our 2022 Heart of the House Report, you will see our "why"s. Every photo in this report is a real RMHC family that has stayed in our House. Some stay for three nights, some have been with us for over 300 nights. These families and their ill or injured child are our "why."

Our "why" is the family whose child is born with a chronic condition, who need to travel from the far corners of our state for monthly doctors appointments, for whom staying in a hotel over a dozen nights a year would be an extreme financial hardship.

Our "why" is celebrating with the couple who traveled from out of state to adopt a baby born prematurely, and who need to be close to the hospital while they wait to take the newest member of their family home.

Our "why" is the tired parent who comes back to one of our Houses after an emotional day by their child's bedside, only to have a small piece of that stress lifted by the warm, homemade meal that welcomes them.

Every single person who supports Ronald McDonald House® has their own, deeply personal "why." It is this "why" that drives us, that has pushed us to bring a holistic care experience to our guest families, helps us rally volunteers to prepare daily meals, and drives us to fundraise to expand and improve our Houses. 

County Breakdown of Arizona Families Served



LAYLA'S STORY

Cheri Ernst and her husband, Peter, were planning a Sabattical to the Pacific Northwest when they received the phone call from their son, Drew, that would change their family's world forever. Drew and his wife, Shanna, were expecting their fourth child in just a few weeks. Shanna had fainted, and was being rushed to the hospital in their hometown of Kingman, Arizona. Following a major heart attack, Shanna tragically passed away in the ambulance on the way to the hospital.

The doctors were able to deliver baby Layla, but she was not expected to live long. The medical team had revived her three times, and no one knew how long she had gone without oxygen. Drew had his other children who needed him at home while they grieved. So Cheri and Peter rushed to St. Joseph's Hospital to be with Layla, who had been airlifted there soon after birth.

As Layla continued to fight, it became clear that Cheri and Peter would be by her bedside for an extended period. And that was when they found Ronald McDonald House. "We knew about this amazing place and all that you did, but not in a personal way," Cheri shared. "The blessing of having someone to help us because we don't have the funds to do this." Over one three-day visit, the nurses told Cheri that "If Layla is going to make it, she needs you here." So far, Cheri has spent 106 nights at our Roanoke House.

"I love my room. It has given me such a safe place to be. I'm not fearful. To know there are such loving people around, like when I have a meltdown and am crying, someone there to tell me it's going to be OK. This place has given me such a base to come back to every night when our world is so completely turned upside down. At 64, I am becoming a mom."

Layla has since been transferred to Phoenix Children's.

Cheri is learning to take care of Layla's specific needs, and remains hopeful. Layla was not expected to survive. Now at 11-months-old, she is breathing without supportive oxygen.

"The House is where I can come and it's my safe place. Everyone is carrying the same pain. Different stories, but same pain. It's raw and there's something really beautiful about that."
